The **San Diego Community College District** (SDCCD) is among the largest of California's 73 community college districts. Annually, it provides education to approximately 90,000 students through its three credit colleges — San Diego City College, Mesa College, and Miramar College — and the seven noncredit campuses of the San Diego College of Continuing Education. The District also serves more than 8,000 active-duty military personnel, veterans, and dependents. SDCCD is overseen by a five-member Board of Trustees, elected by local voters to four-year terms in even-numbered years.

The Board's four student members rotate, while the chancellor, the District's chief executive officer, is responsible for executing policies approved by the Board. The District encourages participatory governance, allowing all constituent groups to partake in planning processes. SDCCD credit colleges offer associate degrees, and career technical certificates are available through the College of Continuing Education and the credit colleges. These courses prepare students for university transfer or employment. The credit colleges also offer bachelor's degrees in high demand fields such as Cyber Defense and Analysis, Health Information Management, and Public Safety Management. The District has active local industry, community, military, and educational partnerships to provide clear career pathways for students. In the 2024-25 fiscal year, the District and its graduates contributed \$5.3 billion to the regional economy. The San Diego Community College District is dedicated to fostering a diverse and inclusive environment where every student can **Be** their true selves. Our collaborative approach ensures that everyone feels that they **Belong**. Students, faculty, classified professionals, administrators, and community partners work together to create a supportive and dynamic learning experience. We are committed to transformational education that empowers students to **Become** the best version of themselves, achieving their personal and professional goals.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

The San Diego Community College District passed bond measure HH in November 2024 for a total of \$3.5b. Currently, the \$50,000,000 renovation to the historic Educational Cultural Complex Theater is mid-way through construction with a scheduled occupancy of Spring 2027. The District has a \$250m affordable student housing project at City College that is under construction and expected to be ready for occupancy in the fall of 2028, providing 792 beds. The District has started design on the following major projects; Saville Theatre Replacement at City College, the A Building Expansion at City College, Sports and Kinesiology Sciences at Mesa College, Performing Arts Center/Admin and Parking Structure at Mesa College, Performing Arts Center and English/Gallery Building at Miramar College, Early Education Center at Miramar College, Montgomery Field Aviation Instructional Center for Miramar College, the expansion to the welding program at Educational Cultural Complex, the new campus for SDCCE on El Cajon Blvd., and the West City Campus Expansion for SDCCE.

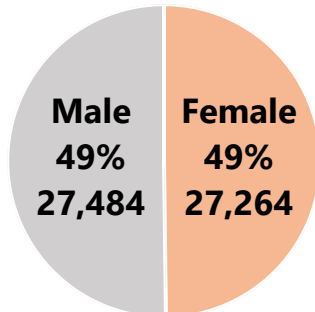

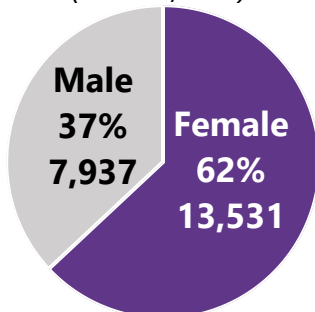

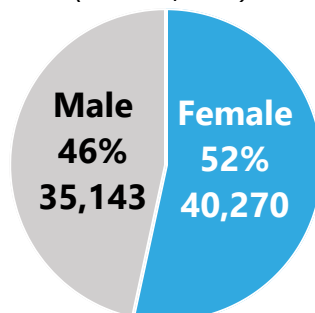

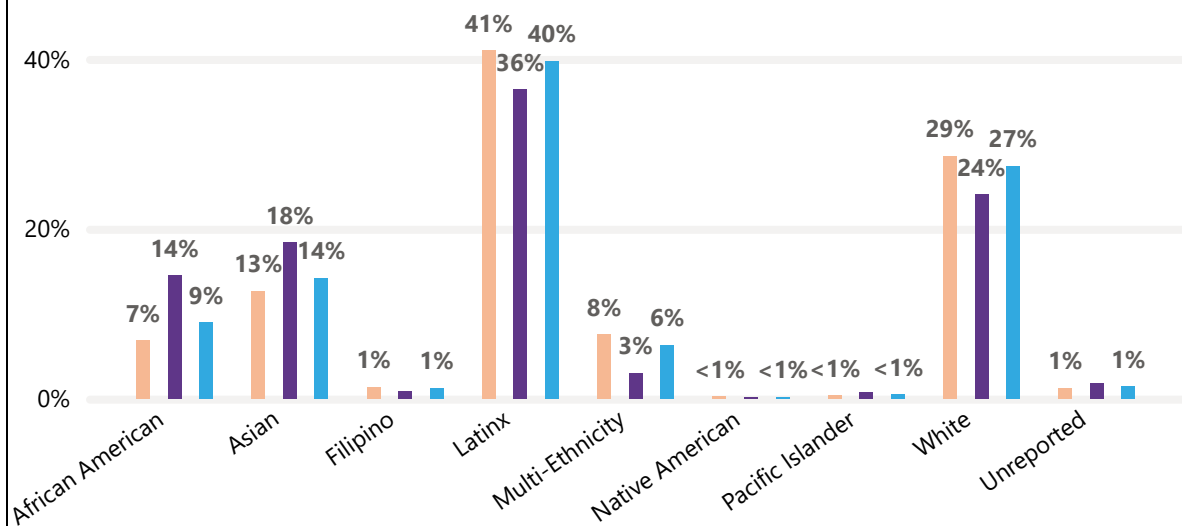

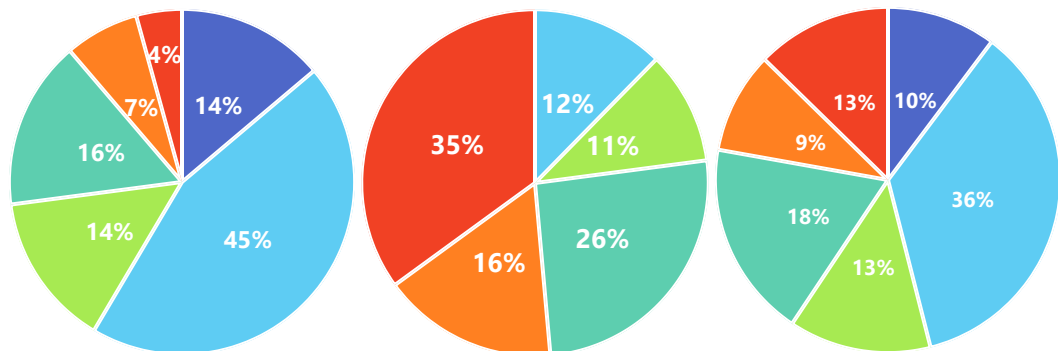

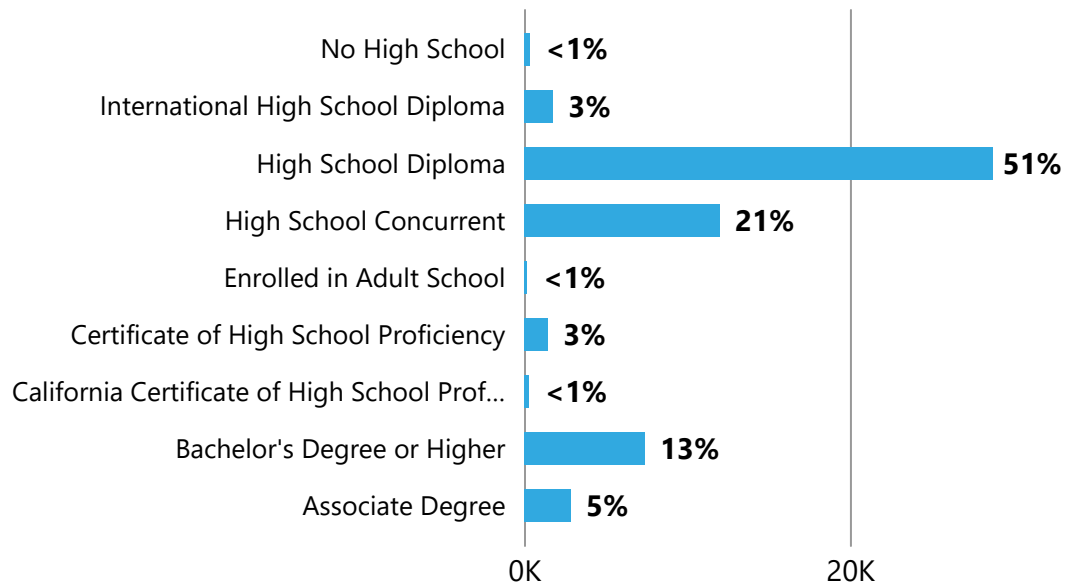

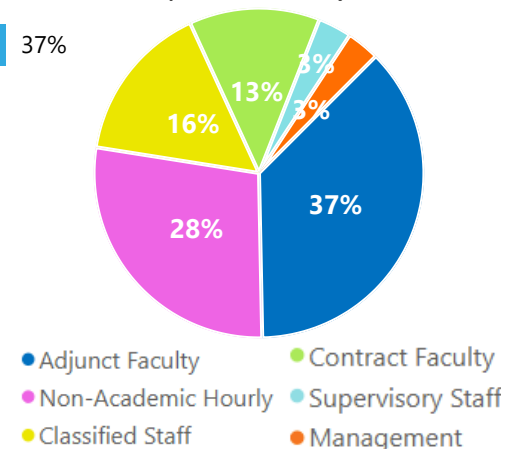

San Diego City College is the region's first community college and has served as the District's flagship institution since 1914. Located on a 60-acre urban campus in downtown San Diego's East Village, the multicultural college serves over 13,000 students per semester and is committed to social justice, educational equity, and academic excellence. In December 2025, City College became one of the first in the state to be designated a Black-Serving Institution under Senate Bill 1348. City College offers over 200 degrees and programs, including its first baccalaureate program in Cyber Defense and Analysis, alongside career technical training in high-demand fields like cybersecurity, biotechnology, machine technology, and environmental control technology.

City College alums are employed throughout the region as engineers, technology specialists, business leaders, radio/TV broadcasters, linguists, cosmetologists, fitness specialists, and child development teachers, to name a few. Nursing graduates work in every major health care facility in the region, and the college's Nursing Education Program is ranked No. 2 in California and No. 3 nationally. The visual and performing arts department also offers theater, dance, music, fine art, and award-winning graphic design and photography programs, which include the Fine Art Gallery and Luxe Photography Gallery highlighting campus and community work. The Graphic Design program has been named the No. 1 Design Education Institution in the world for three consecutive years by the World Brand Design Society. City College is the first choice for many for a quality education, exceptional student support services, and caring faculty and staff.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

With the passage of Measure HH in November 2024, San Diego City College is embarking on a transformative era of campus development. The first four major projects include the construction of an affordable student housing facility at 16th and B Streets; expansion of the A Building to modernize student services and academic spaces; the replacement of the historic Saville Theatre; and upgrades to the gymnasium, including a new HVAC system and the addition of four sand volleyball courts. These projects mark the beginning of a long-term Facilities Master Plan that will guide campus growth over the next 15 to 20 years, ensuring that City College continues to meet the evolving needs of its students and the broader community.

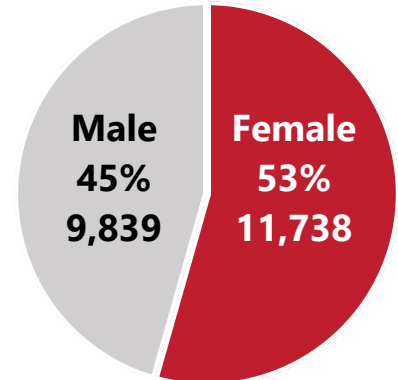

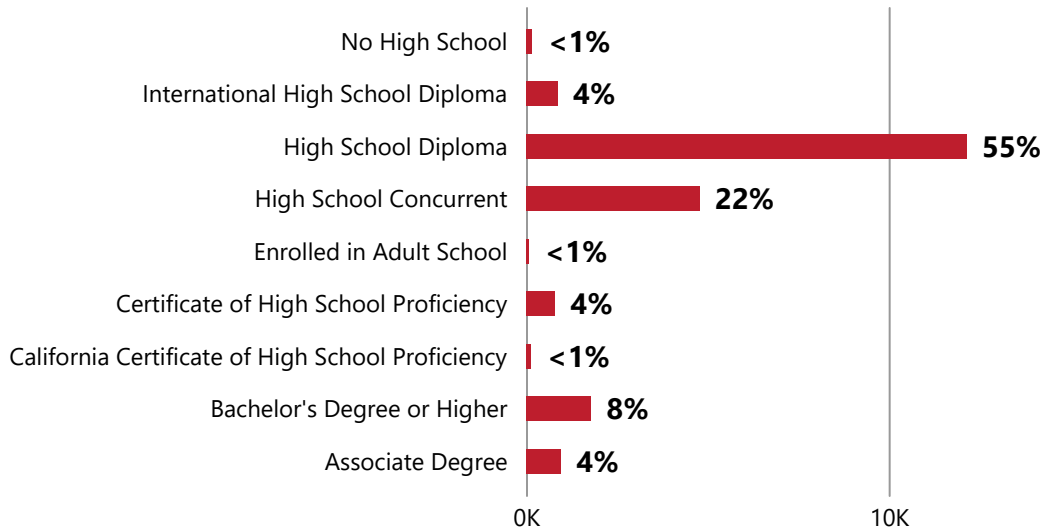

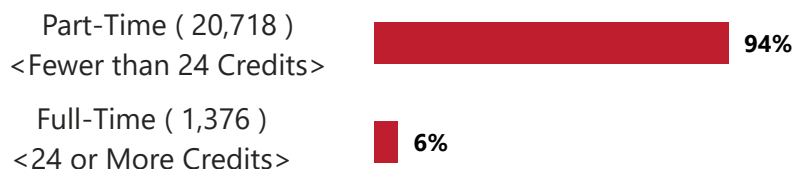

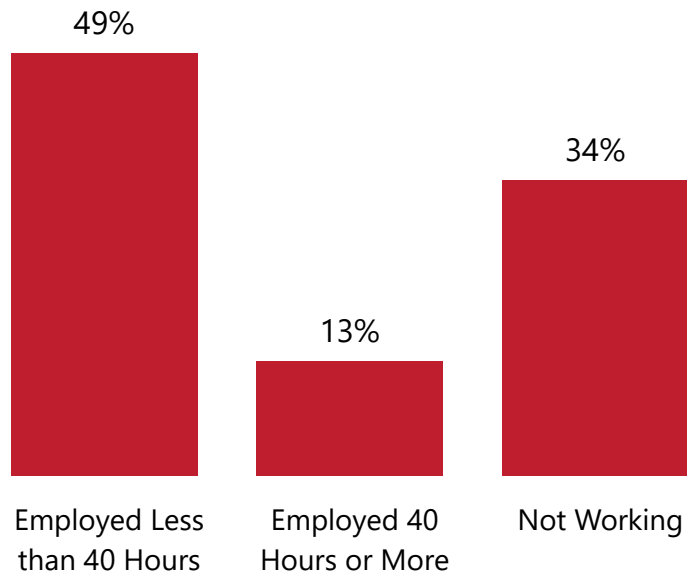

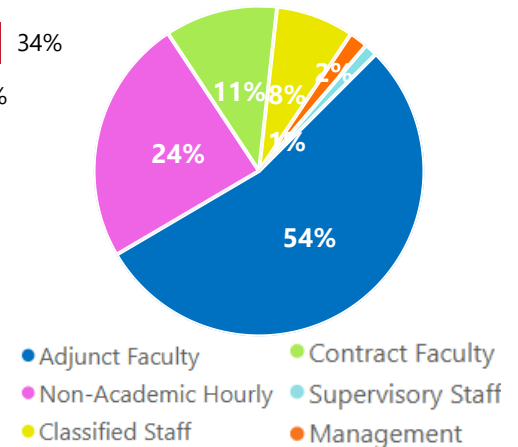

San Diego Mesa College is a fully accredited community college committed to equity, excellence, and fostering an inclusive learning environment for scholarship, leadership, and workforce training. As one of California's largest community colleges, Mesa serves over 31,000 students annually—nearly 30% of whom are first-generation students.

The college offers more than 200 associate degrees and certificate programs, is one of 15 California community colleges offering two or more baccalaureate programs, and stands as San Diego's leading transfer institution alongside its 19 successful athletic teams.

As a proud Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI), a proud Black Serving Institution, Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), a student parent and Military Friendly Gold Status School, Mesa serves more than 5,000 veterans, active-duty service members, and their families. To support its diverse student population, the College offers a variety of learning and support centers, including the AVANZA Engagement Center, Dreamer Resource Center, Family Resource Center, FAST/Foster Youth Center, High Tech Center, Honors Center, Kapwa Umoja Puente (KUP) Center, Pride Center, STEM Center, Veterans Center, and The Stand: The Dr. Pamela T. Luster Resource Center, which provides food and clothing assistance.

Campus Facilities Improvements and Capital Projects

Through the Measure HH Bond Program, extensive stakeholder input is actively shaping major new developments, including a Performing Arts Center and Athletics Complex designed for long-term community wellness and learning. The college has also invested in essential infrastructure, recently completing the Campus Storm Drain Improvement Project to enhance resiliency, alongside initiating gym floor resurfacing and exterior improvements for the Design Center (Z Building).

Further facilities and basic needs enhancements include Learning Resource Center upgrades—such as modernized elevators, new carpeting, and RFID security gates—to improve safety, accessibility, and self-service access. Additionally, Mesa is opening a new SmartMart in the Allied Health Building to expand convenient, nutritious food access on the east side of campus. Together, these capital projects demonstrate Mesa College's dedication to maintaining modern, accessible facilities that drive overall student success.

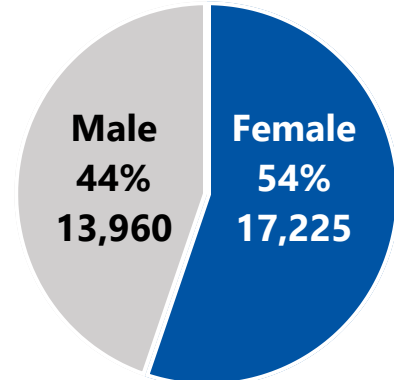

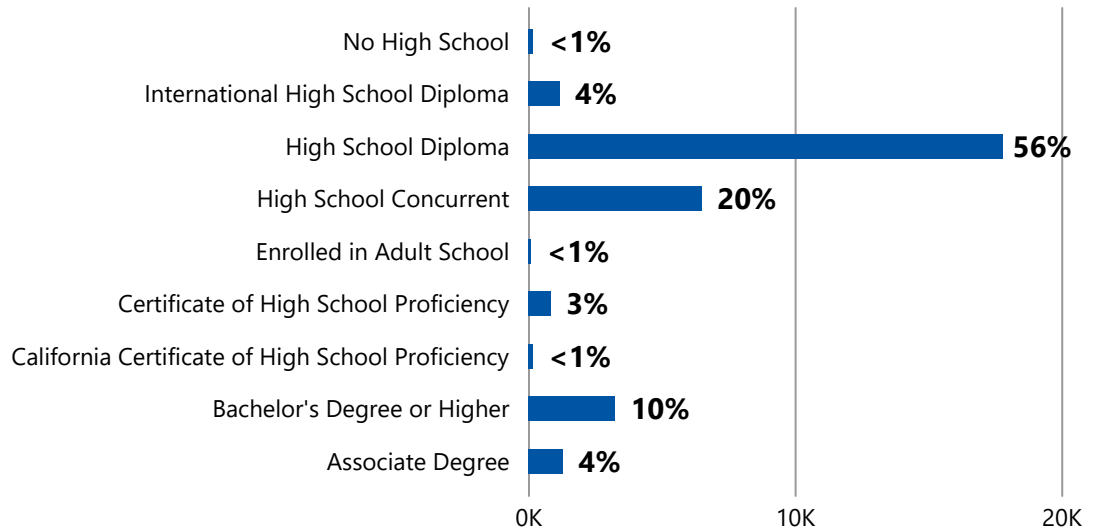

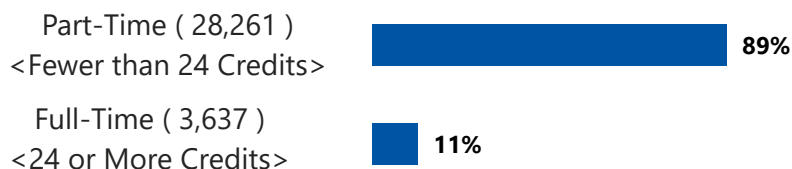

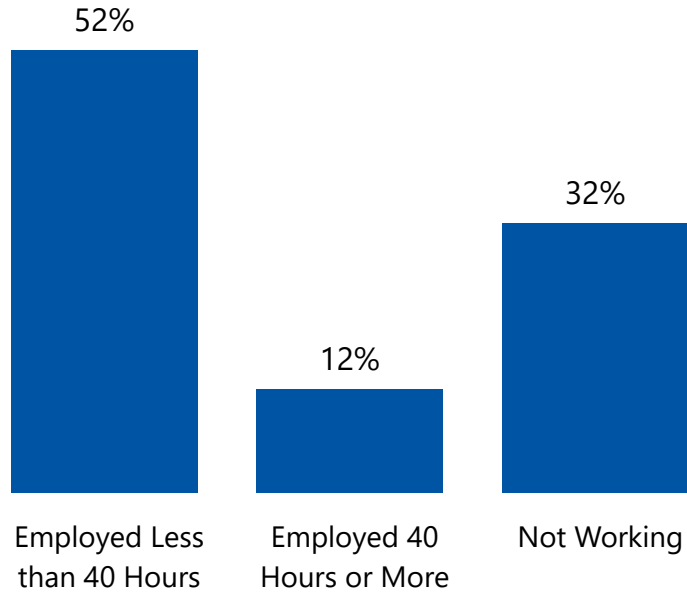

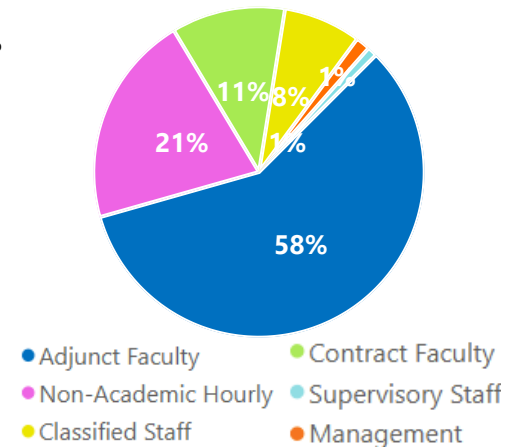

San Diego Miramar College is a comprehensive community college located in the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch area of San Diego. The college offers 173 degrees and certificates in 42 programs and a full range of transfer pathways to students looking to attend UC, CSU, and private universities. The College serves nearly 24,500 students annually.

To enrich student life, Miramar College has established five intercollegiate sports teams and hosts the Phi Theta Kappa International Honors Society. Partnerships with local industry and the City and County of San Diego help Miramar College prepare students for high demand and well-paying careers in the highly competitive labor market, including biotechnology, paralegal, aviation, automotive, diesel, and alternative fuels technologies. Miramar College has been home to the Southern California Biotechnology Center, Advanced Transportation and Technology Center, and San Diego Regional Public Safety Institute. Since 1969, the College has provided training for nearly all law enforcement officers and firefighters within San Diego County. The Public Safety Institute also trains EMTs and offers the only open water lifeguard degree program in the world. The College is proud of its state-of-the-art facilities, including those for departments such as science, automotive, aviation, heavy duty advanced transportation, fitness/athletics/health, humanities/arts and business/math classroom facilities, fire science/EMT training, MTS transit, and a 100,000 square foot library/learning resources center and student union to meet the comprehensive instructional and student service needs of its student body. Each spring, on average, Miramar College awards over 1,100 associate degrees and over 600 certificates.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

Recently completed projects include an infrastructure landscape and pathway project on the west side of Parking Structure 4 allowing for a safe walking path connecting the south end of campus to the quad area and improving the look of that area. Smaller projects include providing ADA parking spaces under some type of shading near parking lot 1 or 2 as required and repairing smart meters to be able to track energy data on individual buildings. After completion of the Propositions S & N projects at Miramar College the campus is now focused on the new Facilities Master Plan which identifies campus facilities and infrastructure that will need to be constructed over the next 15-20 years to support the Educational Program with the passage of Bond Measure HH in November 2024. Miramar College will start the planning and design of the new Performing Arts Center and English/Gallery Building. The Early Education Center will start planning in the fall of 2026 which will replace the existing one, and the Aviation Hanger will be replaced and expanded at Montgomery Field.

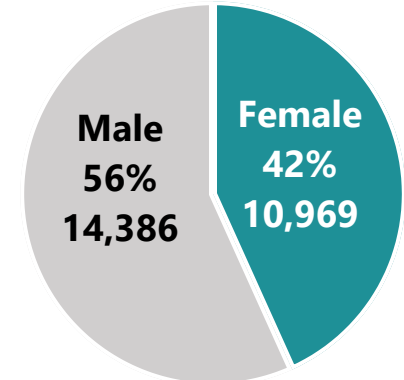

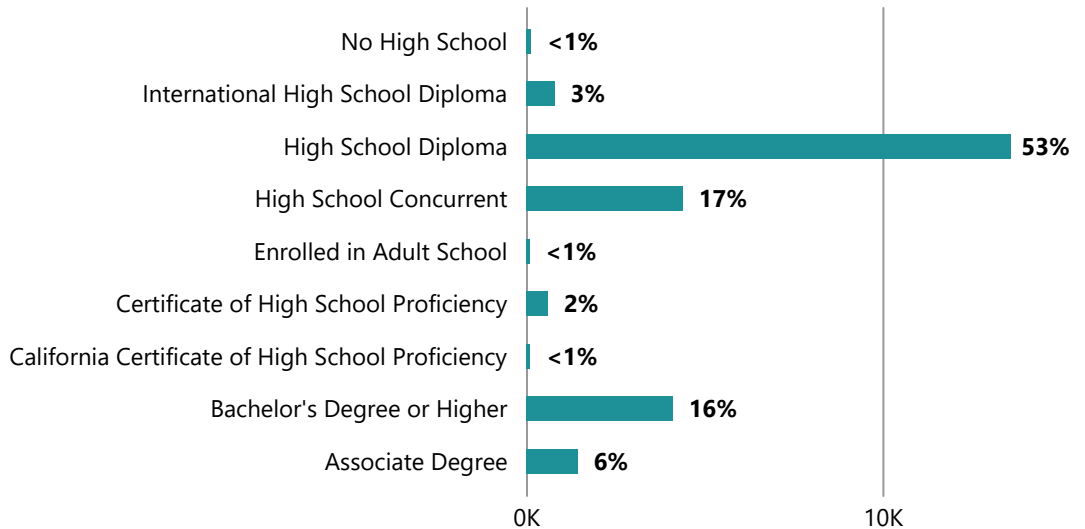

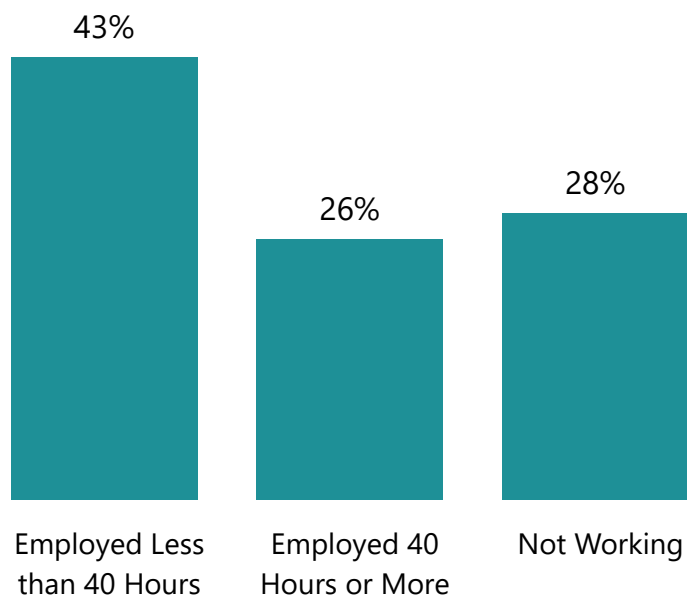

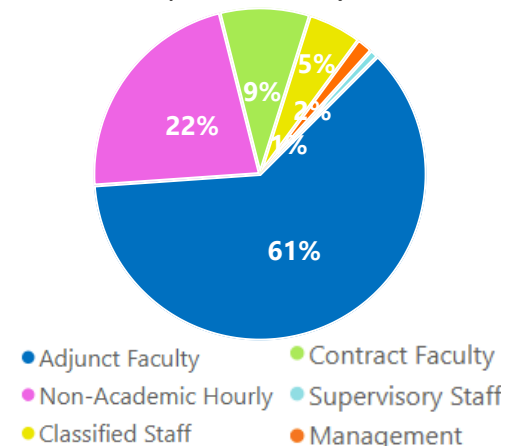

As the adult education arm of the San Diego Community College District, our students are among the most diverse in California—culturally, ethnically, and educationally—and our college is proud to be playing a preeminent role in alleviating poverty in our community.

San Diego College of Continuing Education commits to student success and community enrichment by providing tuition-free, accessible, equitable, and innovative quality education and support services to diverse learners in pursuit of lifelong learning, training, career advancement, and pathways to for-credit colleges. Programs address essential areas of adult education, including short-term career training in priority industry sectors; English as a Second Language; basic skills; an Emeritus program for those 55 years old or older; and Disability Support Programs and Services. The San Diego College of Continuing Education's career training programs alone contribute a quarter-billion dollars to the San Diego regional economy each year. Employers also benefit from customized workforce training through our Employee Training Institute (ETI). San Diego College of Continuing Education was one of the first noncredit institutions in the U.S. to be separately accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), recognized for its impactful community presence, innovative programs, and commitment to transforming lives through accessible education and career pathways. In addition to offering tuition-free programs, the college provides wrap around student support services. Administrators, faculty, and staff are highly qualified, with many holding master's degrees and several holding doctoral degrees.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

The state of California awarded San Diego College of Continuing Education a \$35 million grant to preserve and rehabilitate the historic theatre inside the landmark Educational Cultural Complex (ECC) in the Southeast San Diego community of Mountain View. The project has started construction and is scheduled for occupancy in Spring 2027. The expansion to the West City Campus will continue with Fall 2026 planning/design. Other projects include doubling the size of our award-winning welding program, thanks to \$1.175-million in funds from a Texas-based nonprofit; a new A.I.R. Skills Technical Trades & Workforce Development Center that will directly address a growing statewide shortage of skilled workers in the trades and technical fields such as welding, green technology, electronics, and more; a new Learning and Teaching Center at the North City Campus, and a new eighth campus in the City Heights community bringing new career training opportunities. The San Diego College of Continuing Education is now focused on the future implementation of the Facilities Strategic Plan with the passage of proposed Bond Measure HH in November 2024.

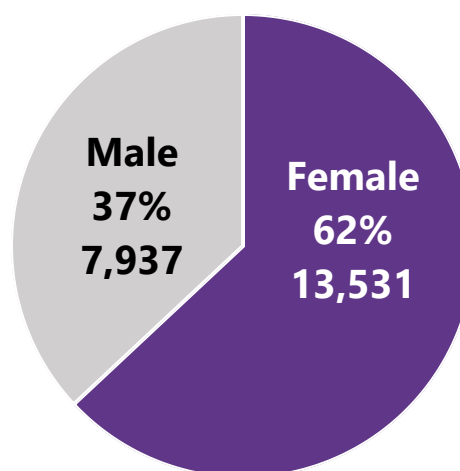

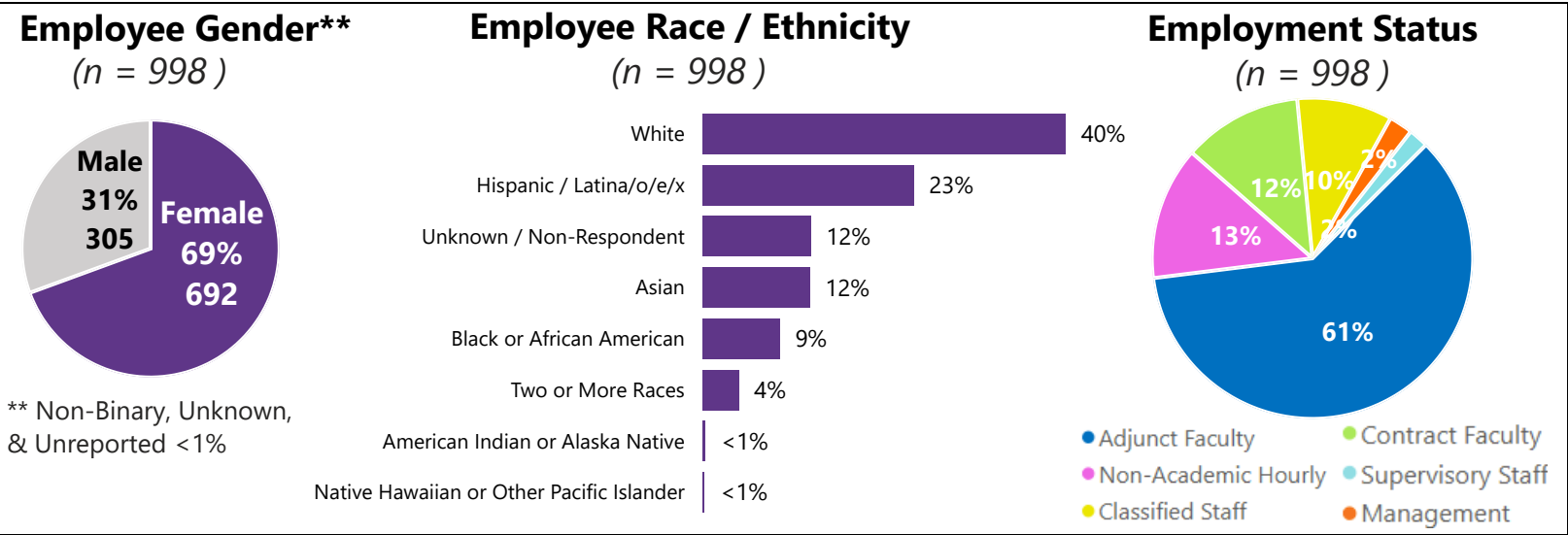

Definition of Terms

San Diego Community College District

ACP

Accelerated College Program. A dual enrollment program in which college courses are offered on high school campuses through an agreement between a high school and Mesa College. The goal of ACP is to accelerate degree completion for highachieving students. High school students receive course credit for both high school and college transcripts.

Annual Year (2025-2026)

For reporting purposes, the 2025-2026 Annual Year refers to Summer 2025, Fall 2025, Intersession 2026, and Spring 2026.

Basic Skills Courses

Courses in English and math that are one level or more below transfer level English and math. Also included are all ESOL courses.

CCAP

College and Career Access Pathways. A dual enrollment program established under California Assembly Bill 288 (2016) that serves students underrepresented in higher education. Under CCAP, a high school enters into an agreement with a community college to offer college courses on the high school campus. CCAP courses are closed to the public. High school students receive course credit for both high school and college transcripts.

Concurrent Enrollment

High school students enrolled in courses on the college campus outside of a CCAP or ACP agreement. This includes enrollments outside of any agreement. High school students receive course credit for both high school and college transcripts.

Contact Hours

Number of student contact hours for all methods of accounting including: WSCH, DSCH, PA, PO, PQ, IS, and IX.

Course Completion Rate (*Previously Retention Rate*)

The percentage of students who complete a course with a grade of A, B, C, D, F, P, or NP out of total official census enrollments. Tutoring, challenge exams, and Credit for Prior Learning are all excluded.

Degrees, Certificates, and Diplomas

The number of degrees, certificates, and diplomas awarded in Summer 2025, Fall 2025, and Spring 2026.

Enrollment - Credit Colleges

The number of seats enrolled, or duplicated headcount. Drops, never attends, cancelled, Challenge Exams, Credit for Prior Learning, and tutoring classes are excluded.

San Diego Community College District

Enrollment - College of Continuing Education

The number of seats enrolled, or duplicated headcount. Less than one attendance hour, drops, never attends, apprenticeship, non-state supported, and cancelled classes are excluded.

First Generation Students

Students who have identified themselves as the first generation in their family to attend college.

FTES

The total number of full-time equivalent students enrolled. Excludes non-state supported, cancelled, and tutoring classes. F-Factor is included.

Headcount

The individual count of students, or unduplicated headcount. Drops, never attends, Challenge Exams, Credit for Prior Learning, and cancelled classes are excluded. Apprenticeship, contract, and fee-only students are also excluded from SDCCE.

San Diego Promise

These numbers reflect unduplicated headcount for Fall 2025 Promise Participants. The Campus listed is the "home" campus where students received Promise services. This count includes 2025-2026 Promise participants that signed a commitment contract and participants from the 2024-2025 cohort that returned for a second year and signed a re-commitment contract.

Students Receiving Financial Aid

The number of students who were enrolled as of official census and received financial aid.

Success Rate

The percentage of students who complete a course with a grade of A, B, C, or P out of total official census enrollments. Tutoring, noncredit, Challenge Exams, Credit for Prior Learning, and cancelled classes are excluded.

Transfers (SCFF Methodology)

The total number of students who transferred to a 4-year institution and were enrolled at an SDCCD college at any time within the prior academic year and earned 12 or more units in that year. Students with enrollment at SDCCD during the year of transfer are excluded.
